

Save the Date! Friday, February 7 at 11 AM. Ocean Village and the Beach & Dune Committee are happy to announce the return of Dr. Zak Jud of the Florida Oceanographic Society in Stuart. Please join us as we learn about reptiles and amphibians in and around Ocean Village. This will be of special interest to pet owners!

Dr. Jud is a dynamic speaker with an in-depth knowledge of the Indian River Lagoon estuary and tributaries, in addition to marine animals. We first met Dr. Jud in 2023 when he shared his knowledge of sea turtles. Last year he helped us understand the immense pressure on water and soils in our area because of nitrates and phosphate. He

is passionate about bridging the gap between the scientific community and the public.

Dr. Jud received his M.S. and his Ph.D. from Florida Institute of Technology in the field of Marine Biology. He is the Director of Education & Exhibits at the Florida Oceanographic Society.



December book review, House of Eve

At the December 2 Ocean Village Book Club session, we discussed *The House of Eve* by Sadeqa Johnson. It is a historical fiction novel that follows the lives of two young Black women navigating love, class, and societal expectations in the late 1940s and early 1950s.

Sedeqa Johnson is a New York Times bestselling author of five novels. Her most recent novel, *The House of Eve*, was an instant New York Times Best Seller. She is a passionate public speaker, writing coach, and teaches for the MFA program at Drexel University.

The novel begins with Ruby, a bright high school teenager, abandoned by her single mother and living with her aunt Marie, a character that is complex and unconventional. Should characters like her be seen as role models for standing up against oppressive systems or should they be criticized for disregarding the laws? We all respected Marie's tenacity to survive against all odds, to provide a home, love, guidance, and understanding for her niece.

Ruby struggles with a forbidden love affair with a white boy that threatens her path to college. The weaponization of women's bodies is a major theme throughout the book.

Meanwhile, Eleanor, a Howard University student whose poverty-stricken parents have worked tirelessly to save for their only child's tuition, falls for a man who is studying to be a doctor. William is from a wealthy elite Black family, forcing her to confront the complexities of fitting into his world. She is especially shocked to see "white" Black couples in William's family home, representing a class system which is prejudiced against lower-class Blacks. Both Ruby and Eleanor face life-altering decisions that shape their futures.

There were different responsibilities placed upon men and women in the novel during the 40's and 50's, specifically, the double standard of what

happens when the woman gets pregnant. Does this still happen in today's world?

The novel revolves around the theme of material bonds and the absence of them. There are a lot of female influences in this novel, such as Ruby's aunt, Ruby's mother, the contrast between Ruby's relationship with her mother and her boyfriend's relationship with his mother, who fights for her son's future without the life-changing event of an unexpected Black child. Eleanor's character struggles for her place in William's life against his powerful mother's control. How do their different upbringings affect their life decisions?

Sadeqa Johnson is an expert at excavating the parts of the past that we would rather not confront. She dusts off these harrowing histories, shines them up, and gives them their proper glory. She mines this terrain with soaring grace, shining intellect, and a love that resonates on every page. Thanks to Johnson's enviable ability to craft narratives that not only educate and elucidate, but also enamor the stories of Ruby and Eleanor and the ancestors and elders they represent, will long be remembered.

With these two women's stories colliding in the most unexpected ways, Ruby and Eleanor will both make decisions that shape the trajectory of their lives.

The January 6 Book Club discussion will be *The Art of Racing in the Rain* by Garth Stein. Steve Hanley will lead this discussion, which focuses on auto racing, dogs, and how to navigate life's ordeals.

The February 3 Book Club selection will be *The Day the World Came to Town* by Jim DeFede, which is a true story behind the events of 9/11 that inspired Broadway's smash hit musical, "Come From Away!"

"Why We Hold the Annual Beach Cleanup"

While you're visiting the lovely beach of our Ocean Village community, many of you contribute to cleaning up all the plastic littering the shore. You're aware that plastics change the environment on South Hutchinson Island unalterably, and you pledge to be one of the Ocean Village residents who removes plastics when you come across them. You grab a grocery bag stuffed into the BlueTube system and scour the sand; eventually discard the refuse you've collected in the trash cans at the base of each crossover.

Perhaps you walk the beach with your grandchildren and use the discovery of plastics as a teachable moment. You point out that living marine creatures are easily fooled by small chips of plastic, thinking they're a yummy food source since they smell so appetizing.

You describe how the green, ladderback, or loggerhead turtles that lay their eggs on our beach might be stopped on their long path if they find a barrier of plastics. You explain how our beach is interconnected with the mangroves to the south of us, which is a unique waterway system home to wildlife like bobcats, raccoons, egrets, spoonbill cranes, and

rabbits -- among others. You explain that plastics have no place beside the mangroves.

You tell your family members about the Ocean Conservancy, which says, from the tiniest plankton to the largest whales, plastics impact nearly 700 species in our ocean. You all try to make sense of the reality that plastic has been found in more than 60% of all seabirds and in 100% of sea turtle species.

You relate to the young ones in language they can digest that the planet's growing plastic crisis carries with it grim predictions -- if humans don't change their plastic consumption habits, the oceans will contain more plastic than fish within 30 years. The world is dumping 18 billion pounds of plastic into the ocean every year, and the world's plastic production is expected to quadruple by 2030.

Becoming conscious of the effects of plastics on your beautiful Ocean Village beach is only the first step, you explain. You describe how to reduce the amount of plastic going into the ocean by choosing materials other than plastic in our consumption. You outline how every person can also be a force to get other individuals to examine their relationship and behavior with plastic.

You are a voice of change, hoping to lead to more pervasive overall sustainable consumption and production.

With this knowledge of the destruction that plastics cause, won't you please join other concerned Ocean Village owners and their guests for our Annual Beach Cleanup? We'll meet at 11 AM on Friday, January 17 on the steps of the new Community Center. From there we'll spread out north and south, on the Ocean Village beach, down to Blue Heron Boulevard and up to Coconut Drive Park Beach. It is a rare opportunity to go into the dune, carefully examining each of your footfalls to avoid our native and rare dune plantings while you pick up debris that has blown in from storms.

We'll have T-shirts for the first 75 participants and a few awards for special litter finds.

We hope you'll join us and share in this wonderful event that builds community, and which creates in us all the habit of protecting the pristine natural world around us from the devastation of plastics.

Happy New Year! Best wishes for a happy, healthy 2025 to each and every one in Ocean Village, be you owner, renter, or friend. I hope you enjoyed the Christmas lighting in the Remembrance Garden. This year the garden was the best ever, thanks to the direction of Scott and Bethann Zaprowski. They were assisted by volunteers shown in the picture. When broken circuits and the heavy rains caused many problems with keeping the lights going, Brian Dennehy and Shelton Struchell added their electrical expertise.

With night visits dominating the attention, it was easy to miss a big surprise in the garden: For the very first time ever, not one, but both of the plumeria trees have produced seed pods. It is very rare for a cultivated plumeria to produce a seed pod, and we have three. The seed pods are twohorned, attached to the limb at the center. The long, hard, leathery, cylinders end in a point. I have tied a net around one of the seed pods on the plumeria on the NE side of the garden, hoping to catch the seed when the pod splits open. Each pod can contain 20-60 seeds. Each seed has a wing on one side that propels it in the wind. Pictures to follow next month?

Many may be unfamiliar with the

plumeria because they usually lose their leaves in late fall and look like dead trees until late spring. There are hundreds of varieties of these members of the dogbane family. At the Farmer's Market they are sold under the common name, frangipani. This name is derived from a 16th century Italian nobleman who created a perfume with a scent similar to the fragrance of the plumeria. The fragrant flowers, which can be white, yellow, pink, or even mixed colors, are often used in leis.

The plumerias in our garden are often bare as a bone during this season, but with the unusual weather we have had this year, we have spotted occasional leaves and blooms, so keep your eye out for more unusual garden happenings. We even had crepe myrtle bloom in September.

Keeping the garden beautiful requires a lot of work. If you would like to lend a hand to water, to weed, to trim, or elsewhere, contact me, Bettie Marshall, at 772-607-1918 (can't get voice mail but can receive texts).

Welcome Back and Happy New Year, Friends! As this is the first installment of the *Seaword* in 2025, I'd like to take the opportunity to thank you all for making the 2024 season another fantastic and memorable year on the golf course. On behalf of my staff, I wish you a very happy and healthy New Year. We still have the most affordable and well-maintained course on the Treasure Coast at \$5 per round. Payment options available – cash, check or credit card. Booking methods available are walk up to the Golf Shop in person, calling (772-467-0102), or via online reservations at Chrono.golf – renters must go to the OV Recreation office to receive a pass code.

Please bring a copy of your lease agreement or a valid parking pass.

Our mission is to make this a pleasurable, safe, and welcoming golf atmosphere. Play 7 days a week from 7:30 AM until about 1 hour before sunset (5 PM). Just a reminder, the course is closed most Tuesdays until noon for golf course maintenance. A good way to meet people is to join the Men's and Ladies' Social Leagues, beginning every Thursday, January 2, and Friday, January 3, or participate in one of our many scrambles.

Next up on the schedule are two fun tournaments, starting with the Welcome Back Scramble (January 6) and Winter String Scramble and Breakfast (January 18). See the complete tournament schedule below or check out Channel 901 for further details regarding upcoming golf events.

The OV course is designed for all levels of golfers. We don't have a strict dress code but please, no flip flops or tank tops! What we expect is respect for our golfing environment, its staff, and its rules and regulations. Please use the sand in the green bins to repair divots on tee boxes and fix your pitch marks on the greens. Don't pull your cart over the greens or the tee boxes. Please utilize the putting green by the shack or the hitting bays by the third crossover to the beach for practice at OV. As tempting as it may be, DO NOT practice anywhere on the course itself during the season.

If you happen to break a window, please report it to the Golf Shop personnel, or OV Security if it is

after hours. You must also wear a valid wristband in order to have access to play on the golf course. NO EXCEPTIONS. It is important to maintain a steady pace of play. (Should play 9 holes in 90 minutes or less) It is advisable to arrive 10 minutes prior to check in so that you will not have to wait. All payments are made at the time of play. Of course, if you have any questions, please do not hesitate to ask me or one of my staff. We want to make sure that we are doing everything possible to positively serve the golf community.

Finally, I am appreciative for the numerous warm seasonal well wishes, gifts, and holiday goodies. Please remember, we value all of your comments and suggestions to help make this your favorite place to be on property. Our "push up" greens have a higher percentage of organic matter and no sub-surface drainage, compared to the standard USGA specification green. They remain saturated longer and are susceptible to anaerobic conditions leading to turf loss. Foot traffic on wet greens, compacting pore space and reducing oxygen capacity, has caused turf loss. When greens' moisture reaches a given threshold, restrictions on play are necessary to preserve the health of the putting surfaces.

Lack of cooperation with closure signs and posts potentially creates unnecessary expenditures to the golf course. As always, our team has been working diligently to maintain and improve the course, ensuring that you have the best possible golf experience. Thank you for being part of our golf community, and we look forward to seeing you on the course soon.






